As a contributor to *The Georgia Straight* since the mid-1980s, he has profiled dozens of celebrities including William Shatner, Salman Rushdie, Emily Blunt and Terry Gilliam. His memoir, *Free Magic Secrets Revealed* (Harbour Publishing) was published in 2013.
