

Richmond's sixth Writer-in-Residence, Dr. Nilofar Shidmehr, is a BC Book Prize-nominated poet and instructor at Simon Fraser University. As both an immigrant and bilingual writer, Nilofar is passionate about working with people from different cultural, ethnic and linguistic backgrounds to help them pursue their dreams of writing. During her residency, she will focus on encouraging participants to share their life stories from multiculturalist perspectives.

Nilofar's books include Shirin and Salt Man (nominated for a BC Book Prize in 2009), Between Lives, Two Nilofars: Before and After Migration (Persian Edition), In the Garden of Exile (Persian Edition), A City, A Woman (Persian Edition). Her poetry and fiction have been featured in many Canadian and Iranian literary magazines and websites, including: The New Quarterly, Room, Descant and Zaman. She is also the Farsi translator of Toni Morrison's The Bluest Eye.

She recently completed a collection of short stories entitled *Divided Loyalties* and a novella entitled *Green Intervals*. Currently, she is working on a novel that reflects the lives of Iranian immigrants living in Vancouver. Nilofar is represented by Morty Mint of the Mint Literary Agency.
